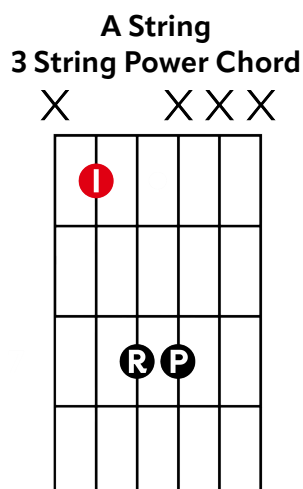
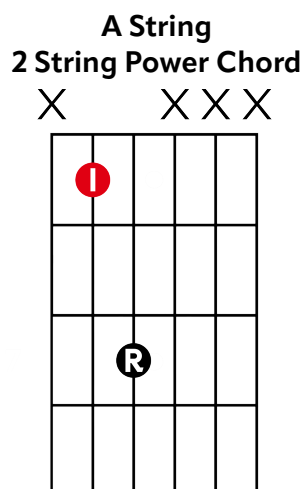
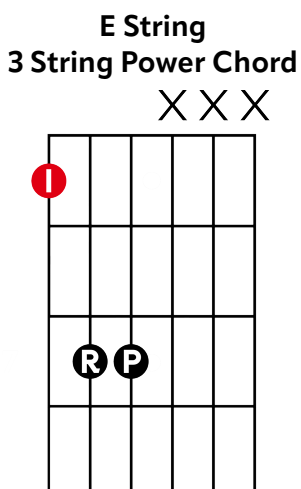
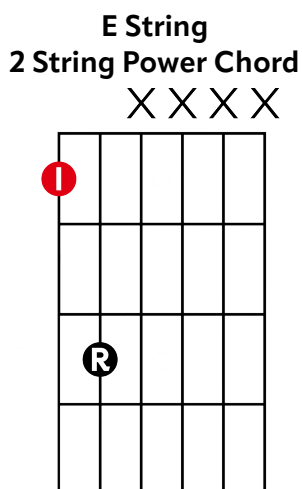


Open Power Chords / 5 Chords



Closed/Moveable Power Chords

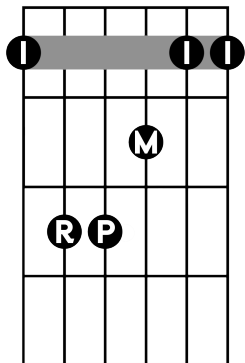
These chords can be moved all over the neck to play **any power chord**. Your index finger plays the **root note**, so whatever note your index finger is playing is the name of the chord. For example, if you're playing a power chord with your index finger fretting a G on 3rd fret of the E string, then you're playing a G power chord.



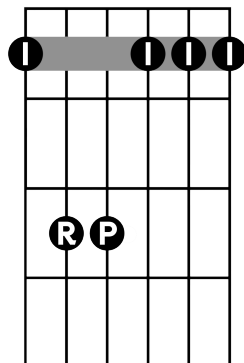
Barre Chords
